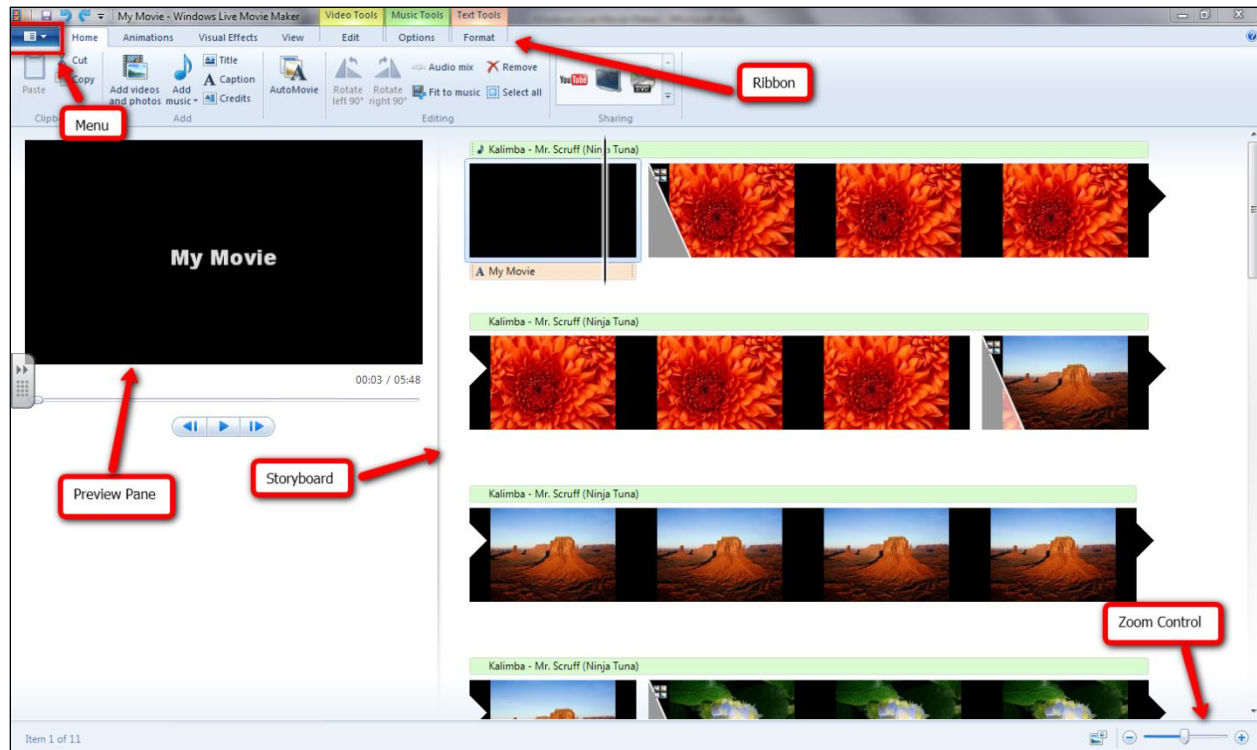


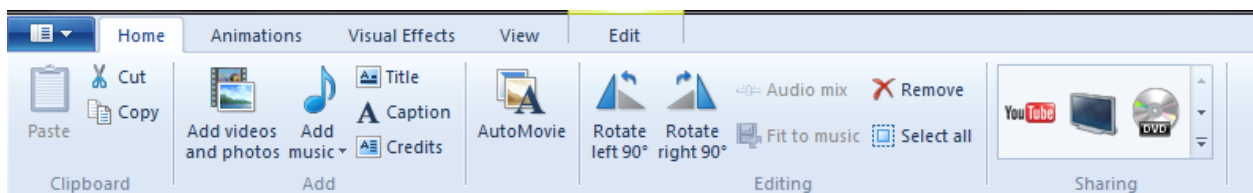
Windows Live Movie Maker Quick Reference

Windows Live Movie Maker makes it simple to produce digital movies with photos and video clips.

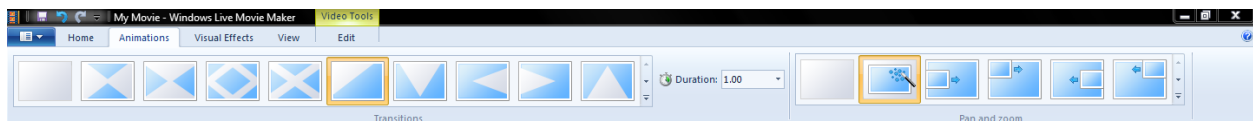


Using Microsoft's ribbon layout, users can find commands grouped together on tabs to perform specific tasks.

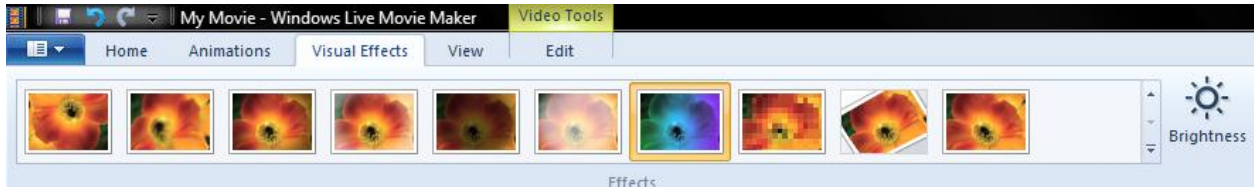
- **Home** – Contains the clipboard, commands for ADDING videos, photos, music, titles, captions and credits; the AutoMovie command that lets you put together a movie in just a few clicks; simple editing features and sharing options.



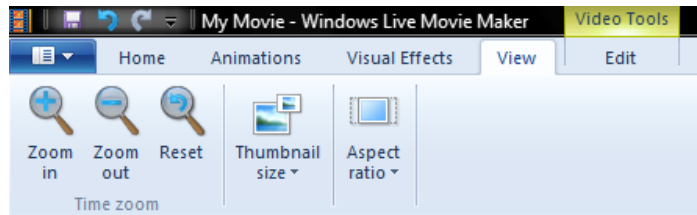
- **Animations** – Allows you to control how each photo or clip transitions to the next one. You can set the duration for each transition. You can also set a "pan and zoom" effect on any of your photos.



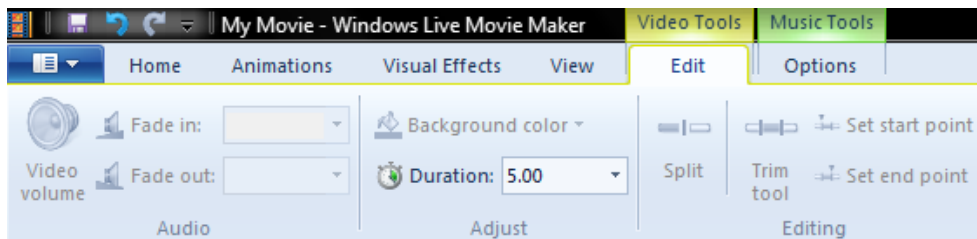
- **Visual Effects** – Allows you to change the visual appearance of photos and video clips. You can also control the brightness here.



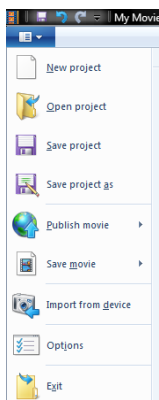
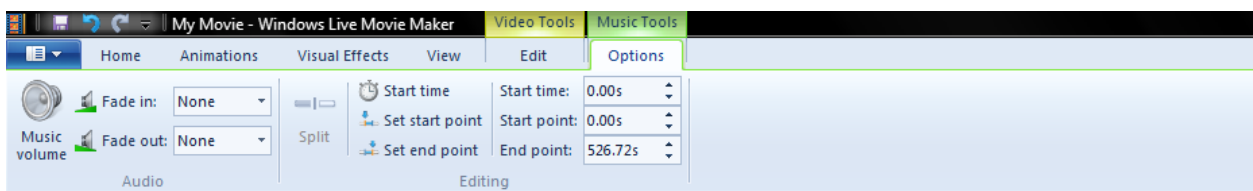
- **View** – Allows you to change the storyboard view to your preference for editing.



- **Video Tools Edit** – This contextual tab (appears “as needed”) and gives you options to control the audio that is part of the original video clip, allows you to set a background color (great for titles), set duration, split and trim video clips.



- **Music Tools Options** – Allows you to adjust music volume, fade in or out, split and/or trim audio clips.



The **Windows Live Movie Maker Menu** gives is where you can start a new project, open or save an existing project, publish or save movie, import from devices (camera, scanner, video camera) and set options for the program.
